Key Points

- Strong bipartisan support for maintaining recent changes to Cuba policy, including six in ten Republicans
- Voters overwhelmingly support ending the U.S. trade embargo on Cuba
- Two thirds of Republicans support relaxing Cuba trade embargo, while only 19% oppose

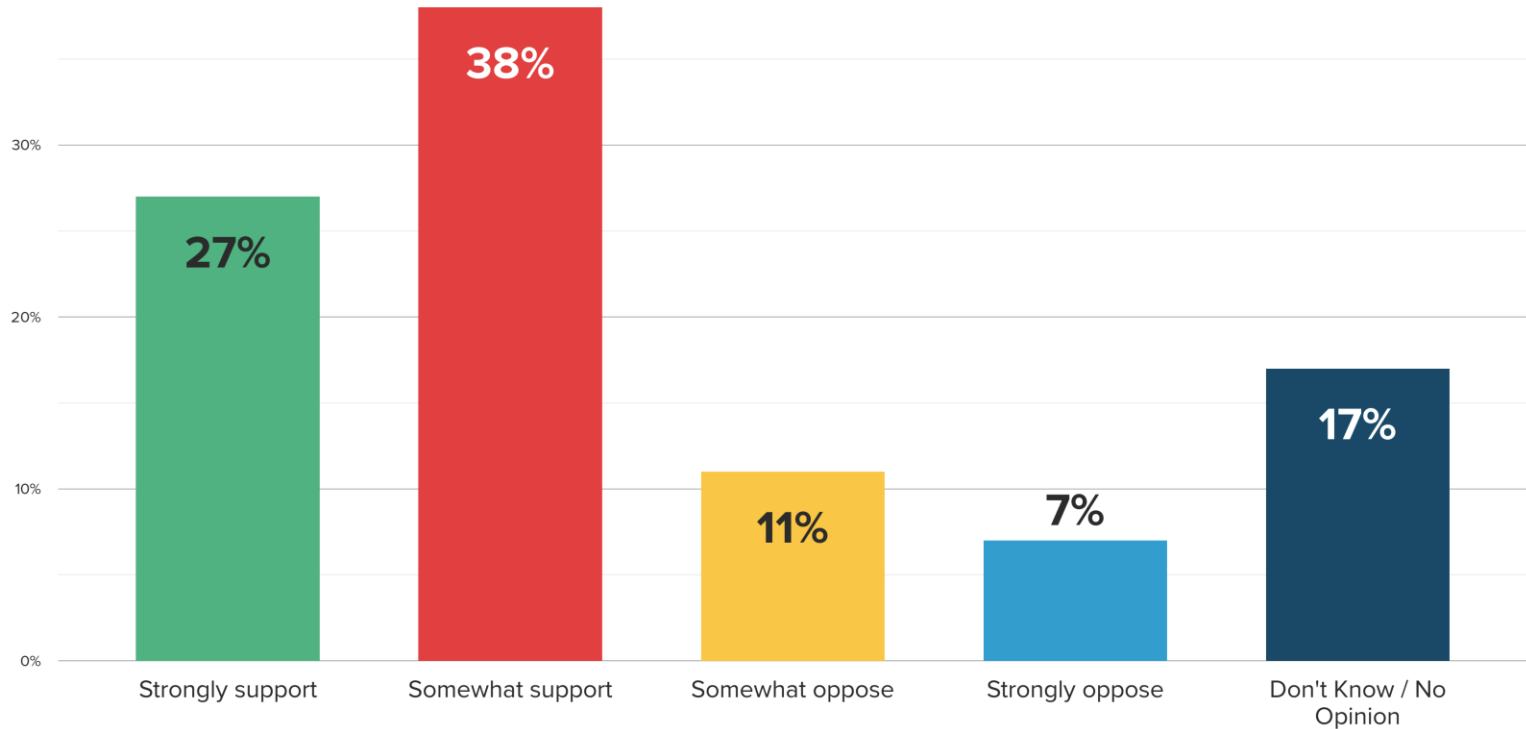
Methodology:

Morning Consult conducted an online survey of 1,973 registered voters from May 23-25, 2017. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of +/- 2%.



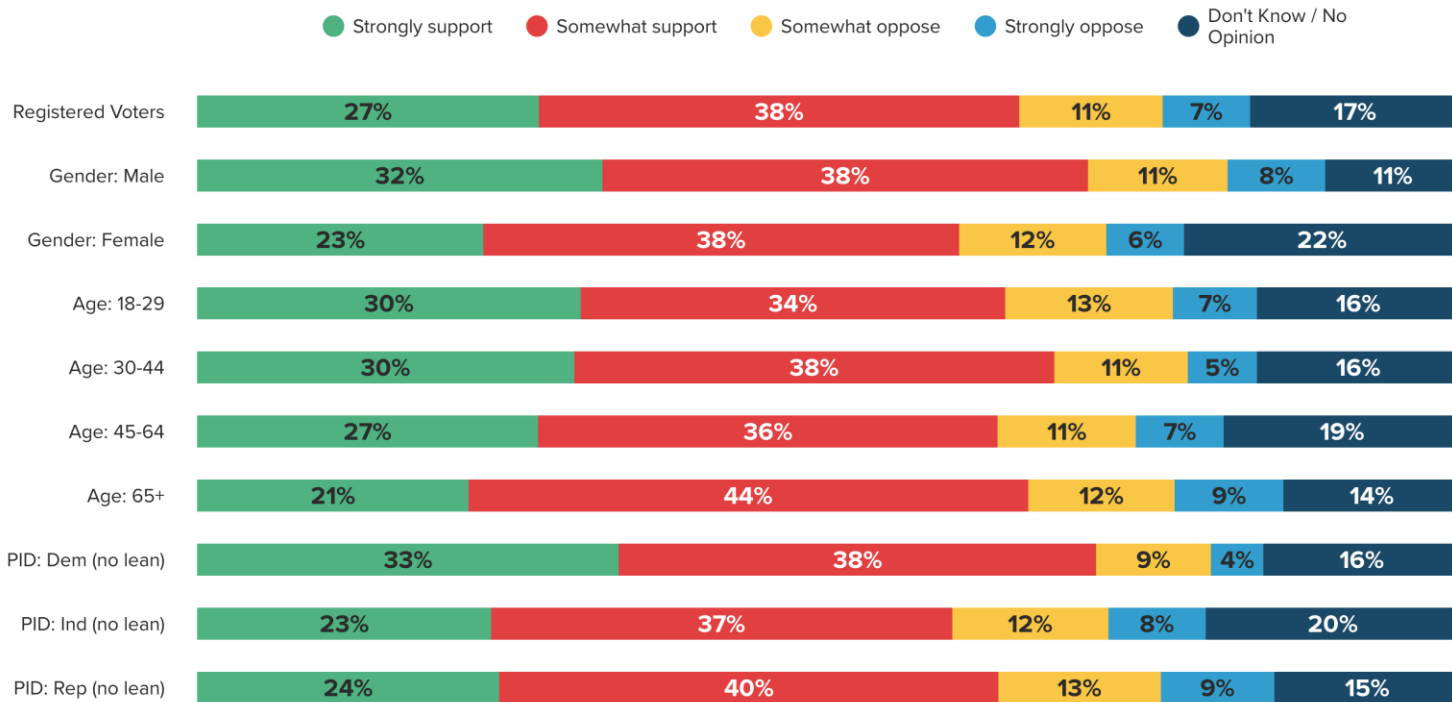
Two in Three Voters Support Recent Policy Changes that Allow For Increased Travel to and Trade with Cuba

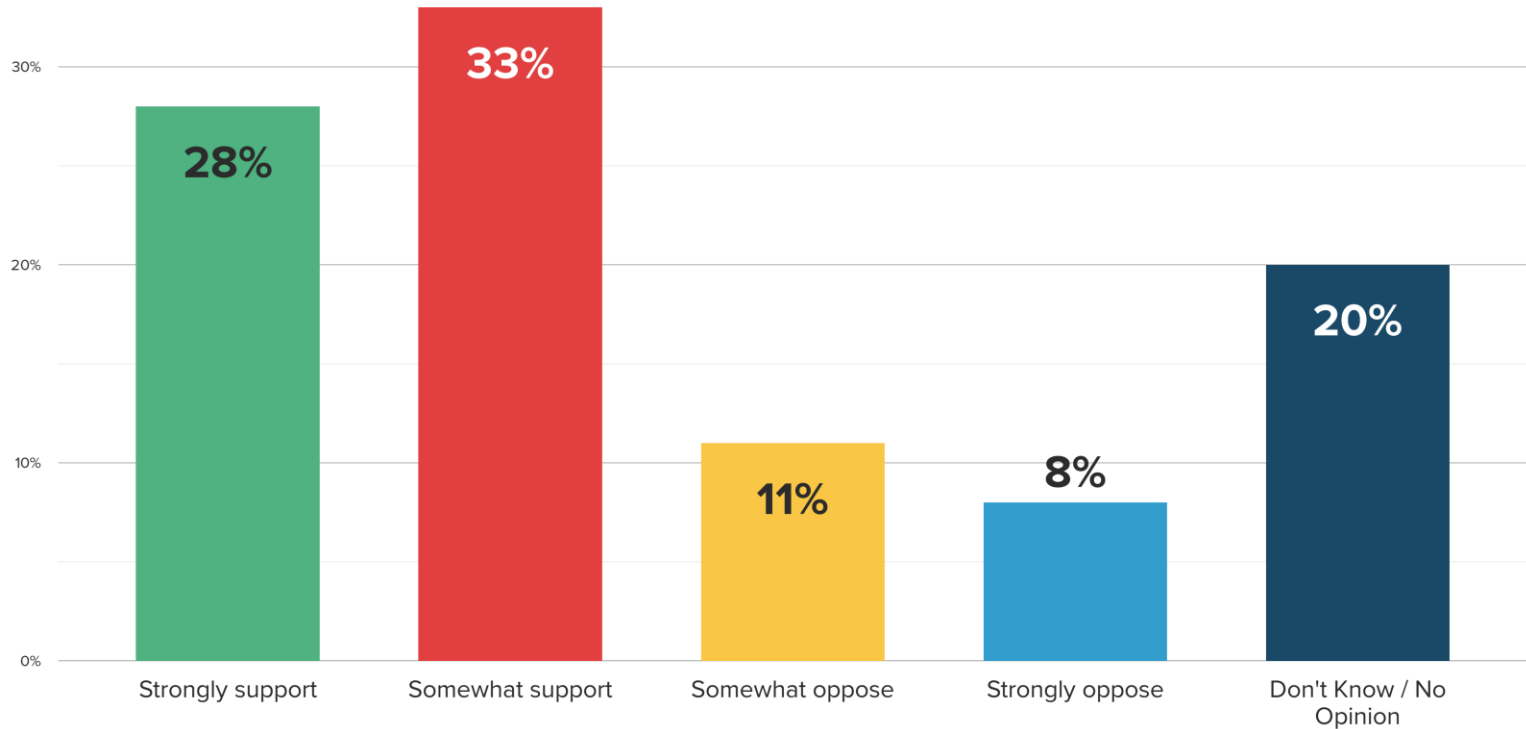
Strong Bipartisan Support for Recent Cuba Policy Changes, Including Over 6 in 10 Republicans
